

Cheap Food in Santa Croce

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Italy is known for its delicious food, especially pasta and pizza, however living in a city like Florence, food can get expensive and fast. I go to school in the center of Florence, near Santa Croce, which gives me a lot of options but I also can't be spending more than €5 for lunch every day. Here are the best, cheap places for lunch, near Santa Croce.

Istanbul

I'm originally from California and the one thing I miss most about my hometown is a good burrito. Istanbul serves up the middle eastern equivalent of a burrito in kebab form. For €5 you get a giant kebab filled with the meat of your choice (or with falafel for the vegetarians). Then it's loaded up with a few kinds of sauces, lettuce, tomatoes, onions, french fries and hot peppers. Bonus, Istanbul also has a punch card so if you eat there enough eventually you'll get a free kebab.

Conad City

Conad is an Italian grocery store stocked full of necessities like shampoo, soap and chocolate. You can also buy lunch there for less than €4. Conad has a great selection of fresh breads, including their pizza foccacia which is about €2. They also sell fresh bread and cheese in their deli section, which is a favorite lunch among my friends and also pretty cheap.

For €2.50 you can get a panino filled with anything you want (or at least anything on the menu). My personal favorite is turkey, mozzarella, pesto and tomatoes. The shop also has a good selection of pastries that are only €1. If you want a sandwich get here before 1pm because after that the line stretches out the door. Although their sandwiches are good enough that I've waited.
